- a) Lack of Road communication problem, Lack of Electricity problem.
- b) Lack of teachers, Classroom in the school.
- c) School Boundary issues, Shortage of teachers and Drinking water problem



1.4. CHILDLINE SE DOSTI

CHILDLINE project organized a Rally & CHILDLINE SE DOSTI campaign against Child Sexual abuse in Kanpali pada of Bolangir municipality Area. Two no. of child festival held Special programme in Madhiapali & Kanpalipada against child marriage, child labour and child trafficking.

2. Project: Down to Zero - Fighting Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children.

Down to Zero is a project supported by ECPAT International through Equitation, The objective of the project was to protect the children from commercial sexual exploitation in Tourist places. The project has been implemented in International Tourist places of Khajuraho and Panna of Madhya Pradesh.

ACTIVITIES UNDER THE PROJECT IN 2018-19

2.1. Specialised support to Boy& Girl children victim of Commercial Sexual Exploitation.

Victims of Child Sexual Exploitation receive services that protect them, help them rehabilitate, reintegrate and reduce vulnerability, like educational services, legal advice, health and shelter care.

On seeing the children, they found roaming behind the tourist every day in exchange they get some money and ultimately the children didn't go to school. On meeting with the family, they came to know that children never go to school, the family protect them in roming behind tourist and guide them to go to school regularly..

Four boy children were admitted to the school and education materials and school kits had provided to them. Those children are now going to schools, their habits has been changed in between. The teachers are also sensitized to guide them properly. Teachers are also taking care of them.

Two girl Children, who used to be addicted to intoxicants, were very much inclined to earn some money, because of the greed that led to the continuous exploitation of the girls.

Both the girls whose financial status is highly taxable and their care in the family is not being taken properly. properly, which was not enough for the child, neither the school was traveling nor the children played with the children, and the child was constantly walking behind the tourists until night.

Project: REDUCING INEQUALITY IN EDUCATION

Activities:- 1

Right to education campaign:-

The campaign was initiated by the members of SMCs on 24.06.2018 to 26.06.2018 where 333 numbers of children and 264 numbers of SMC and PRI members participated. The objective of the campaign was to create awareness on provisions of Right to Education, to generate demand for fulfillment of provisions of RTE in local government schools and to among the community people basically focus on fulfillment of RTE and ECE norms in the village level. Total 597 SMC, PRI members along with children benefited and aware through the campaign.

Activities:-2

Document of cases of in equal from field:-

The activity was initiated with the help of Youth, Children, SMC and PRI members. It aims to documented stories will be find tuned of the project status. The major discussion was on RTE compliance, Learning outcome, MLE education and girl education.

Activities:-3

Media consultation:-

The programme was organized on 5th October 2018 at new hope, Muniguda and 9th October 2018 at Agriculture training hall, Belpada with total of 48 numbers of news reporter; aims to share the ground realities on functioning of public education system.

Activities:-4

Network Interface (civil society consultation):-

The programme was held on 11th October 2018 at Hotel Harsh Inn, Titilagarh with 27 numbers of participants.

Activities:-5

Conduct capacity building workshops for parents and civil societies to demand for equitable quality preprimary education (ECE) and elementary education:-

The two days workshop was organized on 28.09.2018 and 20.09.2018 at Belpada and Muniguda respectively with 99 numbers of SMC and CSOs members. The objective of the workshop was to strengthen the capacity of SMC members on Right to Education, to enhance the knowledge on role of SMC and preparation of SDP. 99 participants participated in the workshop and learn about the process of RTE.

Activities:-6

Engagement of the group with government official on issues of education:-

The activity was organized on 25.12.2018 in Muniguda School and 28.12.2018 in Thudibahal School with 97 number of participants including RTE cadres, SMC and PRI members. The federation members and CSOs all together approaching government officials and representatives to fulfill the norms of education in their respective areas is the major objective of the programme.

Activities:-9

Meeting with education standing committee members parliamentarians and formulating issues:-

The meeting was conducted with the presence of SMC and PRI members to share a memorandum and highlight the education issues to MLAs.

Activities:-10

Encourage participation of SMC & mothers in monitoring and governance of school/ AWCs:-

The activity was started from 01.10.2018 and continued till 25.10.2018 in different areas like Bagdor, Talavata, Bharuapadu, Kumbharkut, Malpada, Kasakhunta, Jharkripali, Thudibahal, Sargipadi Banmal of Belpada block under Balangir District and Sargibadi, Pandra Munda, Dongarbari, Gurugaon, Kadamguda, Urlang, Ladkachanchada, Malingaon, Sukulavata, Rotedi in Muniguda block of Raygada District with the participation of 633 numbers of SMC and Mothers committee. The objective of the meeting was to sensitizing SMC and Mothers committee on their role in Monitoring.

Activities:-11

Mainstreaming of children of migrant workers in schools Multi-Lingual education for tribal children:-

Children of migrant families drop out from schools due to seasonal migration of their families. Balangir is a from Balangir District to Telengana, Andhra Pradesh and Tamilnadu. They migrate every year in October month and return to their home in the month May/June, that's why they loss the complete academic session. The activity was initiated with the active participation of Migrant Families and SMCs aims to mainstream education of migrant children and to reduce dropout.

Activities:-12

Generate evidences from the ground, tracking the progress of schools against RTE and inclusive on quality education advocacy:-

The advocacy was initiated with the help of SMC and Mothers Committee; aims to strengthen public education system in the village through evidence generation, engaging the SMCs and Mothers committee in tracking the progress of ECE and Elementary education in the operational villages.
